

Some equipment has inherent high-risk levels such as the Metal Bandsaw, Cold Saw, Drill Press, Mill Drill, Pedestal Grinder, Metal Lathe, Milling Machine, Mig Welder, Electric Arc Welder, Oxy Acetylene Welding, Plasma Cutter, Angle Grinder, Circular Saw, Metal Cut-Off Saw and Jigsaw. Parents are advised that the Dept of Education does not have Personal Accident Insurance coverage for students. Education Queensland has public liability coverage for all approved school activities and provides compensation for students only when the Department is negligent. If this is not the type and level of private insurance cover for their student (if desired). Courses are funded by the Department of Employment, Small Business & Training. This qualification provides valuable experience in the healthcare environment for those students wanting to go onto further study – particularly in the field of medicine, nursing, midwifery, paramedicine or allied health. The qualification and experience will be an asset in students' preparation for entrance interviews and tertiary course applications. It will also provide students with the qualifications to work in the healthcare sector, whilst undertaking higher tertiary study. Students will also develop an understanding of medical terminology, anatomy, communication and team work and establish a solid foundation on which to build their healthcare career.

Students who start out with a Certificate II in Health Support Services and then pathway to the Certificate III in Health Services Assistance may work under supervision in direct contact with patients in a number of roles including: assistant in nursing; patient care attendant; orderly wards person.
