Courses are 1 day per week during school terms. **Course commencement is subject to enrolment numbers.**

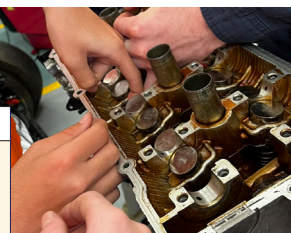
AUTOMOTIVE

AUR20720 Certificate II in Automotive (Vocational Preparation)

Learn to perform a range of tasks relating to identifying and inspecting mechanical and electrical components and systems of light vehicles, heavy vehicles, outdoor power equipment, bicycles, marine craft and motorcycles. Develop skills and knowledge required to perform minor automotive maintenance Prepares students for entry level roles or Apprenticeships.

CPC20120 Certificate II in Construction Pathways

An introduction to the construction industry, its culture, occupations, job roles and workplace expectations. Units cover essential work health and safety requirements, industrial and work organisation structure, communication skills, planning, and basic use of tools and materials. Students undertake a basic construction project.

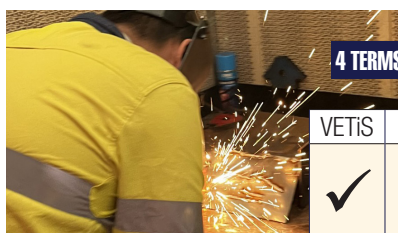
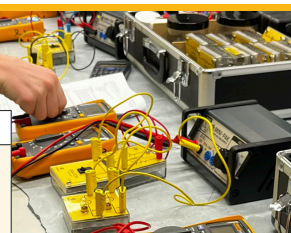
ELECTROTECHNOLOGY

UEE22020 Certificate II in Electrotechnology (Career Start)

This qualification provides entry-level learning activities grounded in safety, as well as basic skills and knowledge required for work in any electrotechnology discipline. Strong Maths and problem solving skills are essential for success in this course. Students completing this qualification will develop a range of basic skills that will prepare them for Apprenticeships.

MEM20422 Certificate II in Engineering Pathways

Develop skills and knowledge in a range of engineering and manufacturing tasks which will enhance prospects for apprenticeships, traineeships or general employment in an engineering-related workplace. Students will learn to plan and estimate as well as work with tools, equipment and machinery for fabricating an engineering project using metal.

PLUMBING

11054NAT Certificate II in Plumbing Services

Students will work towards competencies that support gaining work in the Plumbing industry. Grounded in safety, including the Construction White Card, and basic skills and knowledge for working safely in the sector. Successful completion of the course will provide students with a range of skills that prepare them for Apprenticeships. 80hrs work placement in is mandatory.

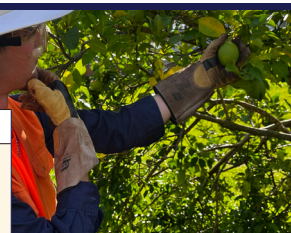
HORTICULTURE

Students will carry out routine tasks under supervision, and develop safe work practices relevant to working in the natural environment. Work placement with nurseries, landscapers and other horticultural workplaces is encouraged and supported by BNWTTTC.

CHILDCARE

CHC22015 Certificate II in Community Services – Childcare

This qualification aims to provide a pathway for workforce entry as childcare workers. Students will learn to provide a first point of contact and assist individuals and families in meeting their immediate needs. Practicals will take place under direct, regular supervision within clearly defined guidelines. Work Placement is required for completion of this course.

ALLIED HEALTH PATHWAY

HLT23221 Certificate II in Health Support Services (VETiS)

HLT33021 Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance (Fee)

Learn about working in healthcare, basic medical terminology, and hygiene practices. Students who complete the Cert II Health Support can progress to the Cert III Allied Health. They will learn about working in a range of health workplaces under the supervision of Allied Health Professionals (AHP). 120 hours work placement in an Allied Health workplace is mandatory.

BUSINESS

BSB50120 Diploma of Business

This comprehensive Business course is designed for future business leaders and entrepreneurs. It suits students who are ready to lead others. They learn how to develop and implement successful business, project and marketing plans; lead teams, manage meetings and projects; identify and pursue business opportunities; and work effectively alongside others.

Trade Pathways Program 2027

Accelerated Senior for Trade-Based Career Pathway

Students commencing Year 11 in 2026 may apply to participate in this accelerated senior program focused on developing a trade-based pathway, aligned with the student's interests and strengths.

Students will complete a program of compressed senior English and Maths subjects, as well as additional qualifications including their trade preparation program or school-based apprenticeship to attain at least 20 QCE credits over the 38-week program (one school year). This program is a partnership between Brisbane North West Trade Training Centre and Mitchelton State High School, as well as our industry-standard RTOs.

In addition, students will complete Certificate III New Business & Entrepreneurship (BSB303220), selected to provide them with a wide range of business skills relevant to sole traders.

Trade Pathways: Automotive, Construction, Electrotechnology, Engineering, Plumbing



BNWTTTC facilitates the delivery of VET qualifications for students in Years 10, 11 or 12 seeking to further their education through additional training in various trades and industries.

Most courses are funded by the Department of Trade, Employment, and Training (DTET) through "VETiS". This program covers training fees for VET courses that are aligned to jobs and skills in demand. Students are eligible for funding to complete one qualification. Non-VETiS funded courses are indicated on the Application Form (P.4 of this guide) and indication of fees is provided upon request.

Training is delivered by Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) selected from DTET's Skills Assure Suppliers (SAS) list.

Students enrolling in our courses co-enrol 0.2 (equivalent of 1 day/week) with Mitchelton State High School, as the lead school for the BNW Technical Trade Training Centre. This ensures activities in the Centre comply with student protection, curriculum activity risk management and other legislated requirements, including One School and record of attendance.

Please note: places are limited in each course, course commencement and training days are subject to enrolment numbers and availability of trainers.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION TO MEET MANDATORY STUDENT SUPPORT REQUIRED FOR CO-ENROLMENT WITH MITCHELTON SHS, AFTER ACCEPTANCE INTO COURSE

Students undertaking courses at the Trade Training Centre gain skills using a range of tools and equipment whilst undertaking learning tasks. Some equipment has inherent high-risk levels such as the Metal Bandsaw, Cold Saw, Drill Press, Mill Drill, Pedestal Grinder, Metal Lathe, Milling Machine, Mig Welder, Electric Arc Welder, Oxy Acetylene Welding, Plasma Cutter, Angle Grinder, Circular Saw, Metal Cut-Off Saw and Jigsaw. Parents are advised that the Dept of Education does not have Personal Accident Insurance coverage for students. Education Queensland has public liability coverage for all approved school activities and provides compensation for students only when the Department is negligent. If this is not the case, then all costs associated with injury are the responsibility of the parent/ caregiver. It is a personal decision for parents as to the type and level of private insurance cover for their student (if desired). Courses are funded by the Department of Trade, Employment & Training.
